I. Call to Order / Roll Call / Determination of Quorum/Pledge of Allegiance

Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) Chairperson Dave Castagnacci called the meeting of the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization (TPO) Citizens Advisory Committee (CAC) to order at 1:15 p.m. The roll was called, and it was determined that a quorum was physically present. The meeting was held in a hybrid format with sixteen voting members and one non-voting member physically present; and one voting and one non-voting member virtually present.

The Pledge of Allegiance was given.

MOTION: A motion was made by Mr. Feldman to allow members attending virtually to participate and vote. The motion was seconded by Mr. Stancel and carried unanimously.

II. <u>Public Comment/Participation</u>

There was no public comment/participation.

III. Action Items

A. <u>Review and Approval of the June 18, 2024 CAC Meeting Minutes</u>

MOTION: A motion was made by Mr. Storke to approve the June 18, 2024 CAC minutes. The motion was seconded by Mr. Feldman and carried unanimously.

B. <u>Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2024-## Amending the FY 2024/25 to FY 2028/29</u> <u>Transportation Improvement Program (TIP) (ROLL CALL VOTE REQUIRED)</u>

Ms. Nicoulin provided detailed information regarding the proposed amendments to the FY 2024/25 to FY 2028/29 TIP. She presented the "roll-forward amendment," which is a routine process that ensures projects from the previous TIP are carried forward into the new fiscal year. This amendment captures ongoing projects that need to continue into the new TIP year. Additionally, there are a few new projects being introduced, as well as a project already in the TIP that has received additional funding. Funding was secured through Legislative appropriations during the last Legislative session for a few projects, which she reviewed.

Ms. Nicoulin addressed CAC members' concerns regarding how to find the location and the scope of work for the projects and why the interchange at SR 100/Seminole Woods wasn't included on this list.

MOTION: A motion was made by Ms. Karl to recommend approval of Resolution 2024-## amending the FY 2024/25 to FY 2028/29 Transportation Improvement Program (TIP). The motion was seconded by Ms. Deyette and carried unanimously by roll call vote.

C. <u>Review and Recommend Approval of Resolution 2024-## Amending the FY 2024/25 and FY 2025/26 Unified</u> <u>Planning Work Program (UPWP) (ROLL CALL VOTE REQUIRED)</u>

Ms. Nicoulin provided a detailed overview of the proposed UPWP, explaining that it is the TPO's two-year work plan and program, with an associated budget. The amendment she discussed impacts the budget. She reviewed the proposed amendments and noted that future consultant support services will be amended into the UPWP as new projects arise.

Ms. Nicoulin responded to the CAC members' inquiries regarding whether this amendment will expand the scope of any existing consulting contracts, the extent of the budget increase, the inclusion of engineering services, and whether the TPO is aware of the funding amounts received by other TPOs.

MOTION: A motion was made by Mr. Feldman to recommend approval of Resolution 2024-## amending the FY 2024/25 and FY 2025/26 Unified Planning Work Program (UPWP). The motion was seconded by Mr. Storke and carried unanimously.

D. <u>Review and Recommend Approval to Change the Name of The River to Sea Transportation Planning</u> <u>Organization to the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization</u>

Ms. Nicoulin explained that the TPO recently completed an apportionment process, during which they reviewed their planning area boundary and membership. The TPO Board approved an Apportionment Plan that expanded the TPO's boundary to include all of Flagler County. This plan was submitted to the Governor's office in January and received approval last week. The TPO will now update its interlocal agreement with all jurisdictions in its

planning area. As part of this update, the TPO Board is proposing a name change from the River to Sea TPO to the Volusia-Flagler TPO to better represent the geographic area that is served. Next week, the TPO will present a resolution to the board to facilitate this name change through a fictitious name registration before the interlocal agreement is fully executed, as the approval process across all jurisdictional governing bodies may take a couple of months.

Ms. Nicoulin addressed the CAC members' questions concerning the cost implications of the name change, the origin of the name change proposal, and strategies to maintain the solidity of historical contracts.

MOTION: A motion was made by Mr. Feldman to change the name of the River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization to the Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization. The motion was seconded by Mr. MacFarlane and carried unanimously.

IV. <u>Presentation Items</u>

A. Presentation and Discussion of FDOT's Central Florida Safety Strategic Plan

Ms. Loreen Bobo, FDOT District 5 Safety Administrator, delivered a PowerPoint presentation on FDOT's Central Florida Safety Strategic Plan. She provided an overview of District 5's fatality statistics since 2016 and outlined the nine-month process of developing the Safety Strategic Plan, which emphasizes safer street designs, behavior change, and a commitment to achieving zero fatalities and serious injuries. Ms. Bobo also mentioned that FDOT is forming a steering committee to monitor annual progress and prioritize future actions. An annual safety summit will bring together all partners, with the most recent summit having been held on May 17, 2024.

Ms. Bobo addressed CAC members' inquiries on several key issues, including identifying changes in behavior, balancing street design with costs, efforts to allocate more funding for safety improvements, who develops street designs, where to find data on fatalities for Palm Coast and Flagler County, the comparison of Florida's texting while driving law with those of other states, and the level of collaboration between FDOT and local law enforcement.

B. FDOT Report

Ms. Powell provided an overview of the FDOT report and noted that the most current project information is available at <u>www.cflroads.com</u>. She also discussed FDOT's 2055 Florida Transportation Plan (FTP), scheduled for adoption in November 2025. The FTP Steering Committee will hold its next meeting on August 21, 2024, at 9:00 a.m. in Merritt Island, with additional meetings planned over the following two months. She also pointed out that FDOT released its third Compass newsletter which she will email after the meeting.

C. Volusia and Flagler County Construction Reports

The Volusia County and Flagler County Construction Reports were provided in the agenda.

V. Staff Comments

Ms. Nicoulin announced that the DeLand SunRail Station held its grand opening ceremony on Friday, August 9, 2024. She also mentioned that Votran is now offering a circulator service that connects with SunRail routes.

Mr. Lunceford announced that Votran, in partnership with the City of DeLand and FDOT, is offering a free circulator service from the DeLand SunRail Station to downtown DeLand. The service operates Monday through Friday from 12:30 pm to 7:45 pm and is primarily intended for tourists visiting DeLand for shopping and dining. The circulator runs hourly with seven stops in downtown DeLand, one of which is within walking distance of Stetson University. Votran will soon install bus stop signs, which are distinct from regular Votran signage. Additional details are available on the Votran website and schedules are available on the back table.

Votran will soon install new bus stop signs, which are distinct from regular Votran signage. Additional details are available on the Votran website and schedules are available on the back table.

B. REVIEW AND RECOMMEND APPROVAL OF INTERLOCAL AGREEMENT WITH THE NORTH FLORIDA TPO FOR URBAN AREA COORDINATION

Background Information:

Following the 2020 Census, the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast-Port Orange Urbanized Area extended into St. Johns County. As part of our approved Apportionment Plan, the River to Sea TPO extended its boundaries to cover all of Flagler County, while St Johns County is currently under the jurisdiction of the North Florida TPO. Consequently, the metropolitan areas of the River to Sea TPO and the North Florida TPO now serve a joint Census Urban Area.

The purpose of this Agreement is to set forth a process by which each of the two TPOs shall conduct the metropolitan planning process in our respective jurisdictional planning boundaries with regard to the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast-Port Orange Urbanized Area and to formalize our cooperation to address the transportation needs in the areas where we share boundaries. In short, the North Florida TPO agrees to continue to plan for the entirety of Johns County, including the portion of the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast-Port Orange Urbanized Area that falls withing its jurisdiction and the River to Sea TPO agrees to plan for the entirety of Flagler County, including the portion of the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast-Port Orange Urbanized Area that falls withing its jurisdiction and the River to Sea

JOINT METROPOLITAN PLANNING AGREEMENT BETWEEN NORTH FLORIDA TPO AND RIVER TO SEA TPO

THIS JOINT METROPOLITAN PLANNING AGREEMENT ("Agreement"), entered on the date indicated below, is by and between the North Florida Transportation Planning Organization ("North Florida TPO") and River to Sea Transportation Planning Organization, a/k/a Volusia-Flagler Transportation Planning Organization ("River to Sea TPO"), hereinafter collectively referred to as "the parties".

WITNESSETH

WHEREAS, the North Florida TPO and River to Sea TPO are metropolitan planning organizations established by Section 339.175, Florida Statutes for the purpose of encouraging and promoting the safe and efficient management, operation and development of surface transportations systems; and

WHEREAS, the metropolitan planning areas of the North Florida TPO and River to Sea TPO serve a joint Census Urban Area containing a 2020 population of 50,000 or more people (UA > 50,000 pop.); and

WHEREAS, 23 USC §134(d) and 49 USC §5303(d), require that MPOs must be designated for each urbanized area with population of more than 50,000 persons as determined by the United States Bureau of the Census, and

WHEREAS, the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast-Port Orange urbanized area was designated and described by the U.S. Bureau of the Census and includes portions of Volusia, Flagler, and St. Johns Counties; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 23 CFR §450.310 and Section 339.175(2), Florida Statutes, the River to Sea TPO was created decades ago and currently has transportation planning jurisdiction over almost all of the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast-Port Orange urbanized area; and

WHEREAS, pursuant to 23 CFR §450.310 and Section 339.175(2), Florida Statutes, the North Florida TPO was created decades ago to have transportation planning

jurisdiction and currently has planning jurisdiction over a small portion of the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast-Port Orange urbanized area, plus the contiguous area expected to become urbanized within a 20-year forecast period for the metropolitan transportation plan, which is located in the Southern portion of St. Johns County; and

WHEREAS, 23 CFR §450.312(h)(1) provides that:

(h) Subject to paragraph (i) of this section, where the Governor(s) and MPO(s) have determined that the size and complexity of the MPA make it appropriate to have more than one MPO designated for an MPA, the MPOs within the same MPA shall, at a minimum:

(1) Establish written agreements that clearly identify coordination processes, the division of transportation planning responsibilities among and between the MPOs, and procedures for joint decision making and the resolution of disagreements . . .; and

WHEREAS, 23 CFR §450.314(b) and (d) provides that:

§450.314 Metropolitan planning agreements.

(e) If more than one MPO has been designated to serve an urbanized area there shall be a written agreement among the MPOs, the State(s), and the public transportation operator(s) describing how the metropolitan transportation planning processes will be coordinated to assure the development of consistent metropolitan transportation plans and TIPs across the MPA boundaries, particularly in cases in which a proposed transportation investment extends across the boundaries of more than one MPA. If any part of the urbanized area is a nonattainment or maintenance area, the agreement also shall include State and local air quality agencies. The metropolitan transportation planning processes for affected MPOs should, to the maximum extent possible, reflect coordinated data collection, analysis, and planning assumptions across the MPAs. Alternatively, a single metropolitan transportation plan and/or TIP for the entire urbanized area may be developed jointly by the MPOs in cooperation with their respective planning partners. Coordination efforts and outcomes shall be documented in subsequent transmittals of the UPWP and other planning products, including the metropolitan

transportation plan and TIP, to the State(s), the FHWA, and the FTA.; and

WHEREAS, Section 339.175(6)(j), Florida Statutes, provides that:

(6) POWERS, DUTIES, AND RESPONSIBILITIES.—

(j)1. To more fully accomplish the purposes for which M.P.O.'s have been mandated, M.P.O.'s shall develop coordination mechanisms with one another to expand and improve transportation within the state. The appropriate method of coordination between M.P.O.'s shall vary depending upon the project involved and given local and regional needs. Consequently, it is appropriate to set forth a flexible methodology that can be used by M.P.O.'s to coordinate with other M.P.O.'s and appropriate political subdivisions as circumstances demand.

2. Any M.P.O. may join with any other M.P.O. or any individual political subdivision to coordinate activities or to achieve any federal or state transportation planning or development goals or purposes consistent with federal or state law...; and

WHEREAS, Section 339.175(10)(a)2., Florida Statutes, provides that:

(10) AGREEMENTS .---

(a) Each M.P.O. shall execute the following written agreements, which shall be reviewed, and updated as necessary, every 5 years:

2. An agreement with the metropolitan and regional intergovernmental coordination and review agencies serving the metropolitan areas, specifying the means by which activities will be coordinated and how transportation planning and programming will be part of the comprehensive planned development of the area; and

WHEREAS, the primary purpose of this Agreement is to implement 23 CFR §§450.312 and 450.314, to comply with Section 339.175(10)(a)2., Florida Statutes, and to implement Section 339.175(6)(j)1. and 2., Florida Statutes, by setting forth a process by which each of the two MPOs shall conduct the metropolitan planning process in their

respective jurisdictional planning boundaries with regard to the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast-Port Orange urbanized area, plus the contiguous area expected to become urbanized within a 20-year forecast period for the metropolitan transportation plan, which is located in the Southern portion of St. Johns County; and

WHEREAS, the governing boards of the North Florida TPO and the River to Sea TPO have reviewed this Agreement and find that it is in the public interest to adopt this Agreement for the purpose of coordination of transportation planning in the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast-Port Orange urbanized area, plus the contiguous area expected to become urbanized within a 20-year forecast period for the metropolitan transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, the economic interest and for promotion of the public transportation safety in the Northeast Florida region that this Agreement is adopted; and

WHEREAS, there is a need to address transportation on a regional basis to meet growing travel demands and obtain federal and state funding in the current competitive funding process in the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast-Port Orange urbanized area, plus the contiguous area expected to become urbanized within a 20-year forecast period for the metropolitan transportation plan; and

WHEREAS, the agreement of the parties is memorialized through this Agreement, which is an interlocal agreement pursuant with Section 163.01, Florida Statutes,

NOW THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION of the mutual terms, understandings, and conditions, hereinafter set forth, the parties hereby agree as follows:

1. Recitals; Definitions.

A. The foregoing recitals are true and correct and incorporated herein by this reference.

B. The following terms as used in this Agreement are defined as follows:

(1) "Agreement" means this instrument as amended from time.

(2) "LRTP" means a Long-Range Transportation Plan created by a MPO pursuant to Section 339.175(7), Florida Statutes.

(3) "MPA" means the metropolitan planning area and is defined as set forth in 23 CFR §450.101.

(4) "MPO" means a metropolitan planning organization as created pursuant to 23 U.S.C. §134 and Section 229.175, Florida Statutes.

(5) "TIP" means a Transportation Improvement Program plan created by a MPO pursuant to Section 339.175(8), Florida Statutes.

(6) "UPWP" means a MPO's Unified Planning Work Program created pursuant to Section 339.175(9), Florida Statutes.

2. **Purpose**. The purpose of this Agreement is to formalize the agreement between the parties to continue to cooperate in carrying out the metropolitan transportation planning process. The North Florida TPO and River to Sea TPO enter into this Agreement to set forth the obligations and responsibilities so as to best manage the interconnections. The purpose of the Agreement is not to be an approval of a merger of the individual parties into a single metropolitan planning organization.

3. <u>Effective Date</u>. Consistent with Section 163.01(11), Florida Statutes, this Agreement shall become effective upon the recordation of this Agreement with the Clerk of the Circuit Court in the Public Records of Duval County, in the Public Records of St. Johns County, in the Public Records of Volusia County, and in the Public Records of Flagler County, Florida ("Effective Date").

4. **Obligation and Responsibilities**. The North Florida TPO and River to Sea TPO agree to the following:

- A. The parties will cooperatively develop and share information related to transportation performance data; and
- B. The parties will provide each to the other with information on proposed alignments or transportation improvements that will impact the area in which the parties share boundaries; and
- C. The parties will coordinate to assure the development of consistent metropolitan transportation plans and five-year Transportation Improvement Programs (TIPs) with respect to that transportation

improvement; and

- D. The parties will cooperate on the selection of performance targets and the reporting of performance targets; and
- E. The parties will cooperate on the reporting of performance to be used in tracking progress toward attainment of critical outcomes for the region; and
- F. The parties will cooperate on the collection of data for the State asset management plans for the National Highway System ("NHS") for the shared UA.; and
- G. The parties will keep each other informed of changes and other information in a spirit of continuing cooperation.
- H. The parties agree that these coordination efforts and outcomes shall be documented in subsequent transmittals of the UPWP required by Section 339.175(9), Florida Statutes, and other planning products.

5. Planning Jurisdiction and Responsibilities.

(a) All MPO transportation planning relating to the UPWP, TIP, LRTP, requirements of this Agreement, or any matters assigned by Federal or Florida law, relating to portions of the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast-Port Orange Urbanized Area located within St. Johns County shall be within the exclusive jurisdiction and authority of the North Florida TPO. All MPO transportation planning relating to the UPWP, TIP, LRTP, requirements of this Agreement, or any matters assigned by Federal or Florida law, relating to portions of the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast-Port Orange Urbanized Area located within Flagler or Volusia Counties shall remain within the exclusive jurisdiction and authority of the River to Sea TPO.

(b) Notwithstanding the foregoing, the North Florida TPO and the River to Sea TPO, each pledge to consult with one another in promotion of the common goal of comprehensive transportation planning with regard to matters relating to the Daytona Beach-Palm Coast- Port Orange Urbanized Area located within St. Johns County or within Flagler County within five (5) miles of the Flagler County/St. Johns County line.

6. <u>Liability</u>.

(a) The parties agree that nothing created or contained in this Agreement shall be construed, interpreted or inferred to establish any joint liability amongst or between the parties by the actions or omissions of its individual governing board members, officials, employees or agents, in their official or personal capacities acting pursuant to the terms of this Agreement.

(b) As provided by Section 768.28(19), Florida Statutes (2024), the North Florida TPO, and the River to Sea TPO, each further agree that no provision of this Agreement shall require one party to indemnify or insure another party to this Agreement for the other party's negligence or to assume any liability for the other party's negligence. Neither the North Florida TPO, nor River to Sea TPO, each by entry into this Agreement waives any defense of sovereign immunity, or increases the limits of its liability. Each MPO shall bear its own attorneys' and paralegal fees for any action for damages or to enforce this Agreement either at law or in equity.

7. <u>No Joint Employment</u>. The parties agree that this Agreement is not intended, nor does it create any joint employment agreement status between the North Florida TPO and/or the River to Sea TPO, or the employees of one MPO to the employees of another MPO. And further, it is agreed that each employee of the respective parties shall remain under the sole direction, control and employment of only that employer.

8. <u>Notice.</u>

(a) A notice or communication, under this Agreement hereunder by one MPO to another MPO shall be sufficiently given or delivered if dispatched by hand delivery, by nationally recognized overnight courier (*i.e.* – Federal Express, United Parcel Services, *etc.*), or by U.S. certified mail, postage prepaid, return receipt requested. A receipt for giving notice by certified U.S. Mail or nationally recognized overnight courier must be obtained and maintained by the MPO giving notice. Notice is sufficient if given and addressed to the following:

To the North Florida TPO:

To the River to Sea TPO:

Executive Director River to Sea TPO/Volusia-Flagler TPO One Deuce Court- Suite 100 Daytona Beach, Florida 32124

(b) Notices; Addresses; Time. Any party to this Agreement may unilaterally change its addressee or address by giving written notice thereof to the other party but the change is not effective until the change notice is actually received by the other party. For all other noticed matters, notice given by U.S. certified mail, return receipt requested, properly addressed and with postage fully prepaid, is deemed given when deposited in the United States mail within the continental United States, if the notice is thereafter delivered in due course at the address to which properly sent. For all other noticed matters, notice given by nationally recognized overnight courier service prepaid, properly addressed is deemed given when deposited with the courier within the continental United States, if the notice is thereafter delivered in due course at the address to which properly sent. Notice given by manual hand delivery is deemed given only when actually received by the recipient.

(c) Relay of Official Notices and Communications. If either MPO receives any notice from a governmental body or governmental officer that pertains to this Agreement (including but not limited to those notices from FDOT, the Federal Transit Administration, or the Federal Highway Administration), or receives any notice of litigation or threatened litigation affecting this Agreement or matters subject to this Agreement, the receiving party shall promptly send it (or a copy of it) to the other party to this Agreement by giving notice.

9. <u>Term of Agreement and Termination</u>. This Agreement shall have a term of approximately ten (10) years commencing on the Effective Date of this Agreement.

The Agreement shall terminate on December 31, 2034, but the Agreement may be renewed or extended by amendment to the Agreement. In 2029 and 2034, the parties hereto shall examine the terms of this Agreement, and the parties may agree to amend the provisions of this Agreement as may be appropriate. The failure to amend, reaffirm, or re-examine the terms of this Agreement shall not invalidate or otherwise terminate this Agreement. A party seeking to terminate this Agreement must provide written notice to the other party. Upon receipt of the notice of intent to terminate, the parties will enter a written termination agreement memorializing the responsibilities to be provided after the date of termination. No termination shall be effective until the written termination of this Agreement shall be recorded in the Public Records of Duval, Volusia, and St. Johns Counties.

10. <u>Modifications</u>. No modification, amendment, or alteration of the terms or conditions contained herein shall be effective unless contained in a written document executed by the parties, which amendment is recorded in the Public Records of each county as required by Section 163.01(11), Florida Statutes, and said amendatory document shall also be recorded in the Public Records of St. Johns County.

11. <u>Entire Agreement</u>. This document embodies the entire agreement between the parties. It may not be modified or terminated except as provided herein.

12. <u>Severability</u>. If any provision of this Agreement is found by a court of competent jurisdiction to be invalid, it shall be considered deleted here from, and shall not invalidate the remaining provisions.

13. <u>Counterparts</u>. This Agreement may be executed in any number of counterparts each of which, when executed and delivered, shall be an original, but all counterparts shall together constitute one and the same instrument.

14. <u>Additional Agreements</u>. In addition to this Agreement, additional agreements may be executed between the North Florida TPO and River to Sea TPO.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have made and executed this Agreement on the respective dates under each signature, each party by and through its authorized representative.







439124-1 SR A1A from Osprey Drive to north of Mariners Drive

- Contract: E51F9
- Project Start: July 2024
- Estimated Completion: Spring 2025
- Update: The contractor is working on barrier operations and shoulder work.




The purpose of the project is to resurface State Road (S.R.) A1A from Osprey Drive to north of Mariners Drive to extend the service life of the existing roadway. The project will also add two new midblock crossings equipped with pedestrian activated signals known as Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) to alert drivers that a pedestrian is ready to cross. The crossings are planned at Varn Park and south of Westmayer Place. Improved crossings are also planned north of Painters Walk, north of Driftway Terrace, and south of Mariners Drive.

Tuesday, September 3, through Friday, September 6, from 7:00 a.m. to 7:00 p.m.: Motorists can expect single lane closures in both the northbound and southbound lanes on State Road (S.R.) A1A from Osprey Drive to Mariners Drive. Crews will be working on barrier and shoulder operations. Please stay alert and look out for crews maintaining traffic around lane closures with flagging operations.

431922-1 SR 44 (E. New York Avenue) at Kepler Road Roundabout and Safety Improvements

- Project Start: June 2024
- Estimated Completion: Fall 2025
- Update: The contractor is working on clearing and grubbing, installing temporary lighting and erosion control, removing existing concrete, and relocating utilities.



The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is constructing a two-lane roundabout at the intersection of State Road (S.R.) 44 (E. New York Avenue) and Kepler Road in DeLand, Volusia County, to enhance safety and improve the flow of traffic.

Once completed, the roundabout will replace the existing signalized intersection. The roundabout will also have two travel lanes in each direction with right turn bypass lanes at three of the four road connections, a concrete apron to accommodate large trucks, and landscaping in the center island.

Pedestrian safety enhancements include new sidewalks and crosswalks equipped with Rectangular Rapid Flashing Beacons (RRFBs) at the roundabout approaches. Each RRFB will include flashing yellow LED lights to increase drivers' awareness of pedestrians crossing at the roundabout. S.R. 44 will also be resurfaced from approximately 800 feet west of Kepler Road to Talisman Road. Kepler Road will be resurfaced from 650 feet south of S.R. 44 to 1,250 feet north of S.R. 44. Additionally, a center bi-directional turn lane will be added along S.R. 44 from east of Kepler Road to Lake Winnemissett Drive.


The project is currently in Phase 1 of construction. Work will require intermittent traffic shifts and nighttime lane closures, but no detours. The intersection of S.R. 44 and Kepler Road will remain open throughout the duration of the project. See below for a visual representation of the intersection and project work zones during Phase 1. The project work zones are represented by the areas shaded in orange.

FDOT aims to minimize the impact of construction on the traveling public. Constructing this project without detours maintains consistent traffic flow, reducing inconvenience and travel time for motorists.

Drivers should expect delays, avoid distractions, and drive cautiously through work zones.

439864-1 St. Johns River-to-Sea Loop Myrtle Ave. from 10th St. to S.R. 44

- Update: The contractor is completing work within the edge of the parking lot of New Smyrna Beach Middle School. The work in front of the school is anticipated to be completed before students return to school.



The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is constructing a 12-foot-wide asphalt multi-use trail that will travel roughly 1.2 miles along South Myrtle Avenue from 10th Street to Lytle Avenue (State Road (S.R.) 44) in New Smyrna Beach as part of the Florida Shared-Use Non-motorized (SUN) Trail Program. 



<u>447105-1</u> Granada Boulevard (S.R. 40) Safety Improvements from U.S. 1 to SR A1A, with the exception of the Halifax River Bridge

- Estimated Completion: Fall 2025
- Update: The contractor is working on median construction, retrofit lighting, concrete removal, directional drilling, splice boxes and conduit installation.



The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is implementing safety improvements and resurfacing the roadway along Granada Boulevard (State Road (S.R.) 40) from U.S. 1 to S.R. A1A (Ocean Shore Boulevard/South Atlantic Avenue), with the exception of the bridge over the Halifax River in Ormond Beach.

In addition to repaying this segment of S.R. 40, the travel lanes along this segment of Granada Boulevard will be slightly narrowed to ten feet and subtle changes in the roadway alignment will be introduced to encourage slower driving speeds. Pedestrian safety improvements include a new mid-block pedestrian crossing between Vining Court and Boyard Avenue. Upgrades will also be made to existing crossings at Washington Street and west of Beach Street.

The mid-block crossings located west of Beach Street and located between Vining Court and Bovard Avenue will be slightly elevated to be level with the sidewalk and will include in-road lighting to further alert motorists of people crossing the roadway and encourage reduced speeds.

All three crossings will be equipped with a Pedestrian Hybrid Beacon (PHB) and overhead lighting to increase driver awareness and visibility of pedestrians. A PHB is an overhead traffic device that remains dark until a pedestrian activates the beacon, signaling for drivers to come to a stop and for pedestrians to cross. Audible pedestrian signals and detectible warning pads will also be installed at each crossing to provide accessibility for the visually impaired.

Intersection lighting will be upgraded, and new mast arm poles will be installed at the Ridgewood Avenue and S.R. A1A traffic signals. New bicycle lanes next to turn lanes, called keyholes, minor drainage improvements, median modifications, and a new directional median to reduce left-turn conflicts at Washington Street will also be included. Existing sidewalks and on-street parking will remain.

Saturday, August 31, through Friday, September 6, from 9 p.m. to 6 a.m., motorists can expect intermittent single lane closures on eastbound and westbound Granada Boulevard (S.R. 40) from S.R. A1A to S.R. 5. The work includes median construction, retrofit lighting, concrete removal, directional drilling, and the installation of splice boxes, and conduit. All driveways along the route will remain open.


Starting Monday, August 12, the median at the intersection of State Road 40 (Granada Boulevard) and Washington Street will close to traffic for installation of a traffic separator. Travel lanes on S.R. 40 will remain open, but motorists in both directions will no longer be able to turn left onto Washington Street.

Detour: Motorists wishing to access S. Washington Street from westbound S.R 40 will turn left onto Ridgewood Avenue before turning right onto Corbin Ave.

Motorists wishing to access N. Washington Street from eastbound S.R. 40 will turn left onto Ridgewood Ave before turning left again onto New Britain Ave.

The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is resurfacing Woodland Boulevard (U.S. 17-92/State Road (S.R.) 15/600) from Wisconsin Avenue in Orange City to north of Taylor Road (S.R. 15A) in DeLand to extend the life of the existing roadway.

In addition to repaving the travel lanes, the project will upgrade pedestrian curb ramps and existing crosswalks. This project will also modify the existing drainage system to accommodate the proposed sidewalk, signal and roadway work.






The Barracuda Bridge is closed to vehicle and pedestrian traffic.

Barracuda Boulevard, including the Barracuda Bridge, is closed from The Middle Way to Quay Assisi in New Smyrna Beach, Volusia County. This stretch of Barracuda Boulevard will remain closed until project completion, which is estimated to be Fall 2024. Motorists and pedestrians wishing to access the Marine Discovery Center and properties on Quay Assisi and adjacent side streets will be directed through a temporary detour route along Quay Assisi and North Causeway.

Watercraft access will be maintained during construction of the new Barracuda Bridge. However, there will be brief instances in which marine traffic access will be limited in the work zone for safety purposes. During these short closures, boaters are encouraged to use the channel below North Causeway to access Indian River North.

429556-1 S.R. 44 Over the St. John's River Bridge Replacement

- Update: The contractor is working on shoulder work, roadway reconstruction, and vibrocompaction testing.



The purpose of this project is to replace the existing State Road (S.R.) 44 bridge over the St. Johns River, also known as the Whitehair Bridge, with a high-level fixed span bridge. During construction, the existing S.R. 44 bridge will remain open for drivers to use while the new bridge is constructed to the south of the existing bridge. After construction, the existing bridge will be removed.

Old New York Avenue (County Road 4110) under the new bridge structure near Shady Oak Restaurant and Captain Jed's Airboat Rides is closed. This closure is necessary to facilitate the reconstruction of the roadway underneath the new State Road 44 Bridge. During this period, a detour will be in place to guide motorists to their destinations. Drivers will be directed by video message boards and other signage to follow the designated detour route as follows:



- Update: The contractor is installing cabinets, concrete pads, and completing bridge conduit and drill shafts at the northbound weigh station.



The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is constructing virtual Weigh-In-Motion (WIM) and associated Intelligent Transportation System features for the northbound and southbound truck weigh stations in Flagler County. These improvements will be installed along Interstate 95 (I-95) from the Palm Coast Parkway interchange (Exit 289) to approximately 2 miles south of the State Road 100 (East Moody Boulevard) interchange.

WIM systems utilize sensors embedded in the pavement to record the weights of moving commercial vehicles and allow underweight vehicles to bypass the weigh station. Because WIM systems do not require vehicles to stop, they help reduce congestion and keep goods moving to their destination.

Wednesday, September 4, between the hours of 9:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.: There will be a single lane closure for northbound traffic between State Road (S.R.) 100 and Palm Coast Parkway. Crews will be working on the installation of Mast Arm Signals.



Flagler County Design & Construction Projects Report

August 2024

Construction Phase Projects

- USACE/Flagler County Beach Nourishment Project, City of Flagler Beach The USACE has awarded the Coastal Storm Risk Management beach nourishment project to Weeks Marine, Inc., which includes both Federal and Non-Federal reach segments. Construction began on July 5th, 2024, and sand placement was completed on August 30th, 2024. Sand fencing and dune vegetation will be installed, along with post and ropes, that includes signage to keep pedestrians off of the newly planted dunes. This should be completed by mid-October 2024.
- 2. Old Haw Creek from CR 304 to SR 11 Construction in progress and currently on schedule. Primary onsite construction activities include roadway and swale grading, storm drainage structure installation, erosion control and traffic maintenance. Ongoing activities include storm drainage structure installation, roadway and swale grading.
- CR 90 from Hickory St to CR 75 Western segment (1 mile) construction complete; CR 90 Eastern segment (2 miles) construction in progress and currently on schedule. Onsite construction activities include crossing culvert construction, roadway grading and base installation. Upcoming activities include ongoing roadway base installation and roadway paving.
- 4. Commerce Parkway Construction is in progress and currently on schedule. Primary onsite construction activities include clearing and grubbing, erosion control setup, embankment construction and maintenance of traffic. Upcoming activities include construction of stormwater pond facilities, drainage structures, storm sewer construction and turn lanes on US 1.

Design Phase Projects

- 5. Bulow Creek Headwaters Regional Park FDOT LAP Agreement and the Planning Contract with KHA approved by the BoCC in June 2024. Expect commencement of Planning Phase in September 2024.
- 6. Stormwater Master Planning Final report development completed; BoCC Stormwater Master Plan adoption on April 1, 2024. Final deliverables submitted to the County in May 2024. Upcoming advertisement for Capital Improvement Projects design and permitting.



- Walnut Ave Paving FDOT State Funding Grant Agreement (SFGA) executed. Notice to proceed issued to consultant in November 2023. 90% design development is underway. Project on schedule.
- 8. Westmayer Place Paving FDOT State Funding Grant Agreement (SFGA) executed. Notice to proceed issued to consultant in December 2024. 100% design development is underway.
- 9. Canal Ave/CR302 Paving of existing unpaved roadway from Forest Park to Coconut Design phase is underway. Field survey complete. 30% plan submittal reviewed and comments provided back to CMT. 60% plan submittal package submitted, 90% design development is underway. Project limits extended from Coconut to Water Oak. Additional funding received and additional work authorization issued.
- 10. Fire Rescue Station 51 Engineering received project Mid-January 2024 for administration. Task 1 Concept design development complete. Task 2 Design services underway. CMAR RFP is advertised. Project on schedule.
- Fire Rescue Station 62 Engineering received project Mid-January 2024 for administration. Task 1 – Concept design development schematic design submitted to the County. Task 2 – Design services underway. CMAR RFP is advertised. Project on schedule.
- 12. Trailhead at US-1 for Lehigh Trail Design funding anticipated to become available in July (FDOT FY25). Preparations underway to utilize FDOT Continuing Services Contract for design services procurement. FDOT determined that access connection to US-1 would not be approved for the planned project site. Staff has submitted an alternate site to FDOT for consideration.
- 13. Old Kings Road South Multi-Use Trail from County Line to SR 100 Design funding anticipated to become available in July (FDOT FY25). Preparations underway to utilize FDOT Continuing Services Contract for design services procurement.
- 14. SMA Healthcare Men's Receiving Facility Preliminary design currently in progress.
- 15. Permit Modification for Beach Nourishment Project, R-77 through R-44 Engineering analysis has been completed and the application for the permit modification has been submitted. Coordination between BOEM, USACE and FDEP, and FEMA continues throughout the NEPA review process and the Lease Agreement for the offshore sand resources. The Erosion Control Line coordination with FDEP has begun and fieldwork will begin in September.
- Forest Park/CR 35 Road Improvements Funding agreement approved by BOCC September 3rd, 2024. Design anticipated to begin by first quarter 2025
